Ireland/Bantry, Co Cork	<p>West Cork Development Partnership/West Cork Development Partnership and The Attic has been involved The Attic Youth Cafe for 3 years (approx) 2006 to date. The Attic has hosted several volunteers and has found the experience to be very successful overall. European Voluntary Service adds an important intercultural dimension to the youth cafe project. The EVS volunteer is quite often a young person's first independent experience of an individual from another country. The youth cafe is a facility that the young people choose to engage with - they are not forced by parents/ teachers to engage with the space. The young people are able to speak with, engage with and formulate their own opinions about the staff of the Attic without being prompted/ biased by anyone else's opinions. The experience of individuals in other parts of Europe is very different to the experience of Irish individuals and teenagers and this can be fascinating for the young people. Each EVS volunteer brings new experiences to the project and to the young people and enhances their understanding of different cultures and themselves as well. I feel that it is important that there is a level of staff turnover as this illustrates to the young people the cycle of relationships, it shows them that there is a cycle to a relationship/ friendship however long and short and it promotes a positive way of dealing with this when the service ends. I feel that the EVS experience is a very beneficial experience for the young people, for other staff members and for the volunteer themselves as there is a wide and varied learning to be taken from the project.</p>	15 Dicembre	Luglio 2010/9-12 mesi
Ireland /Clonakilty, Co.Cork	<p>The Clonakilty Kindergarten/ This Steiner based Kindergarten is situated in a state of the art building in Clonakilty - the heart of West Cork. The project was developed to provide a childcare service for children between the ages of 2 and 6 and to promote citizenship in general and European citizenship in particular. The project's themes are artistic, cultural and education, with a particular interest in early childhood education and development. The overall objective of the Kindergarten is to maintain a permanent centre in Clonakilty and to cater for the various childcare needs of the local community. Our project operates for a 10 month period from September to June, loosely following a standard academic calendar. Nationalities of children and their families, teachers and volunteers include Irish, British, French, German, Dutch, Nigerian, Polish, Italian, Ghanaian, Czech and Israeli. The project normally works with 2 volunteers each year. Our facilities include summer camps, after school care, parent and toddler groups, parenting training, etc. The Kindergarten is socially inclusive and is open to all children in the community including members of the asylum seeking community.</p> <p>The kindergarten's work stems from the work of Rudolf Steiner, and the three-fold picture of the human being. This education supports the physical, intellectual and spiritual growth of the child. There is a strong emphasis on nature, music, arts and crafts. The education is based on the rhythm of the year (seasons), week and day. The year's calendar of festivals is marked with a celebration. They will be assigned specific tasks or projects as their main area to give them a sense of ownership together with any other activities they may wish to participate in. eg in 2009 some of the volunteers also participate as beach inspectors checking on Blue Flag beaches and following educational activities being carried out.</p> <p>Activities Nature conservation: This will involve managing of nature reserves, conservation work such as clean ups, dry grass cutting, caring for young indigenous trees at the tree nursery, caring and helping in the rehabilitation of injured wildlife specifically marine turtles. Apiculture and Honey making is also part of the activities which may also include other products such as carob syrup making etc. In all cases training will be given</p> <p>Environmental Education: This will involve activities in organising environmental educational events and games for young children, assist in the eco schools programme, assist in school visits to the managed sites, plan and organise kids activities. Assisting in environmental education through cartoon creation both for web sites or books.</p> <p>Youths and Environment: Work with other youths from NTM in organising events for youths awareness in environmental issues, promote the EVS programme, participate in youths events within the University campus such as freshers week etc promoting environmental issues. Volunteers may also do some NGO work such as helping in membership, accounting, eco labels web design etc</p>

Cork	<p>Bantry & Dunmanway SCP/Proposed activities for EVS volunteers</p> <p>Language training: - The volunteer will receive linguistic training as appropriate throughout their stay, via a language school or private teacher arranged by the host organisation.</p> <p>Training and support: - The mentor will meet regularly with the volunteer to check on their progress and help solve any problems. They will also ensure ongoing support for the volunteer. SCP will offer additional support through emails and phone calls. The volunteer will be given any training necessary for them to carry out their tasks. Attempts will be made to help the volunteer integrate into the local community. Volunteers will attend the on-arrival training organised by the National Agency or host organisation as well as nationally organised mid term evaluation events. Most significantly the volunteers will support young people who are at risk and they will gain valuable experience of how to work in a professional manner.</p> <p>The volunteers will be 'School activity assistants'. They will support project worker to deliver a programme of activities involving 'in-school', 'after-school' and 'holiday provision' programmes. This will involve educational support both academic (eg helping with homework) and social. Also sports, art, drama, music, computers, cooking, boardgames etc. there will also be a certain amount administration eg recording.</p> <p>Volunteers often bring new and valuable ideas. If they have a particular skill that can be used it may be appropriate to set up a club involving that skill.
